

Complete Guide to Switching from iPhone to Android

- Go to **Settings > Messages** and toggle off **iMessage**.
- Visit [Apple’s iMessage deregistration page](#) to ensure your number is removed.
- **SMS Backup** ??? Use a third-party app like **SMS Backup & Restore** (available on both iOS and Android) to save your text messages.

E. Save Music & Podcasts

- **Apple Music** ??? If you use Apple Music, download your playlists via the app or export them using **SongShift** (iOS app).
- **Podcasts** ??? Use **Google Podcasts** or **Spotify** to sync your subscriptions.

- **Google Play Protect** â?? Scans for malware (**Settings > Security > Google Play Protect**).

F. Display & Accessibility

- **Dark Mode** â?? Reduces eye strain (**Settings > Display > Dark Theme**).
- **Font & Display Size** â?? Adjust text size and display scaling (**Settings > Display > Font Size**).
- **Accessibility Features** â?? Enable features like **Live Transcribe** or **TalkBack** if needed.
