

Google Pixel 7 Pro Long-Term Review: Is It Still Reliable

Description

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The **Google Pixel 7 Pro**, released in October 2022, was one of the most anticipated smartphones of its time. With its **Tensor G2 chipset, advanced camera system, and smooth Android experience**, it promised flagship performance and long-term usability. But now, over a year and a half later, how does it hold up? Is the Pixel 7 Pro still a reliable daily driver, or has it been outpaced by newer models?
