SM-G998B Modern Samsung Galaxy smartphone

GT-N8000 Older Samsung Galaxy Note 10.1 tablet

2. Device Type & Series (First Letter After Prefix)

The first letter after the prefix indicates the device series:

Letter	Series	Example Models
G	Galaxy S (Flagship)	SM-G998 (Galaxy S21 Ultra)
N	Galaxy Note (Discontinued)	SM-N986 (Galaxy Note 20 Ultra)
F	Galaxy Fold (Foldable)	SM-F926 (Galaxy Z Fold 3)
A	Galaxy A (Mid-range)	SM-A525 (Galaxy A52)
M	Galaxy M (Budget)	SM-M325 (Galaxy M32)
T	Galaxy Tab (Tablets)	SM-T510 (Galaxy Tab A 10.1)
W	Galaxy Watch (Wearables)	SM-R860 (Galaxy Watch 4)
B	Galaxy Buds (Wireless Earbuds)	SM-R175 (Galaxy Buds Pro)

Example:

SM-G998 Galaxy S series (S21 Ultra)

SM-F926 Galaxy Z Fold series (Z Fold 3)

SM-A525 Galaxy A series (A52)

3. Model Number & Variant (Numbers After First Letter)

The numbers following the first letter represent the model and its hardware variant. This section can be broken down into:

A. Generation & Model Number

- The first **two digits** often indicate the generation.
- The remaining digits specify the exact model.

Examples:

??? **SM-G998** ??? Galaxy S21 Ultra (**99** = 21st generation, **8** = Ultra variant)
??? **SM-A525** ??? Galaxy A52 (**52** = 52nd model in the A series, **5** = mid-range variant)
??? **SM-N986** ??? Galaxy Note 20 Ultra (**98** = 20th generation, **6** = Ultra variant)

B. Regional & Carrier Variations (Letters After Numbers)

After the numbers, letters indicate the region, carrier, or hardware differences:

Letter	Meaning
B	Global/International (Exynos chipset)
U	U.S. (Snapdragon chipset, often carrier-locked)
W	Canada (Snapdragon)
N	Korea (Exynos or Snapdragon, depending on model)
F	Europe (Exynos)
D	Dual SIM (DS = Dual SIM, SS = Single SIM)
1	5G variant (e.g., SM-A526B/DS = Galaxy A52 5G)
Q	Snapdragon variant (e.g., SM-G998Q = Snapdragon S21 Ultra)

4. Additional Suffixes (DS, SS, 5G, etc.)

Some model numbers include suffixes that provide extra details:

Suffix	Meaning
/DS	Dual SIM (Dual Standby)
/SS	Single SIM
5G	5G-capable model (e.g., SM-A526B/DS)
LTE	4G LTE-only model
WiFi	Wi-Fi-only tablet (e.g., SM-T510)
4G	4G variant (e.g., SM-A525F/DS)

Examples:

- **926** ??? 3rd generation Fold (Z Fold 3)
- **U** ??? U.S. model
- **1** ??? Unlocked (not carrier-specific)

Conclusion: This is a **U.S. unlocked Galaxy Z Fold 3** with a Snapdragon chipset.

Example 3: SM-A525F/DS (Galaxy A52)

- **SM** ??? Samsung Mobile
- **A** ??? Galaxy A series
- **525** ??? 52nd model in the A series
- **F** ??? Europe (Exynos)
- **/DS** ??? Dual SIM

Conclusion: This is a **European dual-SIM Galaxy A52** with an Exynos chipset.

Example 4: SM-T510 (Galaxy Tab A 10.1)

- **SM** ??? Samsung Mobile
- **T** ??? Galaxy Tab series
- **510** ??? 10.1-inch Wi-Fi-only model

Conclusion: This is a **Wi-Fi-only Galaxy Tab A 10.1** tablet.

Why Decoding Samsung Model Numbers Matters

1. **Region & Carrier Compatibility**

2. Some models are locked to specific carriers (e.g., **SM-G998U** for U.S. carriers).
3. International models (**SM-G998B**) may not support all U.S. 5G bands.

4. **Hardware Differences (Exynos vs. Snapdragon)**

5. **Exynos (Global models) vs. Snapdragon (U.S./China models)** can affect performance and battery life.
6. Example: **SM-G998B (Exynos) vs. SM-G998U (Snapdragon)**.

7. **Software & Firmware Updates**

8. Different regions receive updates at different times.
9. Carrier-locked models may have delayed updates.

Method 2: Behind the Battery (Older Models)

- Remove the back cover and battery (if removable).
- The model number is usually printed on a sticker.

- The model number is printed on the box label.

Method 4: Samsung Members App

1. Open the **Samsung Members** app.
2. Tap **Get help** ?? **About phone**.
3. The model number will be displayed.
