For Apple TV:

1. **Go to Settings > Accounts > iCloud.**
2. **Ensure iCloud Photos** is enabled.

For Windows PC:

1. **Download iCloud for Windows** from the Microsoft Store.
 2. **Sign in** with your Apple ID.
 3. **Check Photos** and click **Options** to enable **iCloud Photo Library**.
 4. **Choose** where to download photos (e.g., C:\Users[Your Name]\Pictures\iCloud Photos).
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Step 5: Wait for Initial Sync to Complete
