Cons:

- Requires a cable
 - Limited to computer transfers
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4. Using Wi-Fi Direct (No Internet Needed)

Steps for Android:

1. **Enable Wi-Fi Direct** on both devices (Settings > Connections > Wi-Fi Direct).

Steps for iPhone (AirDrop):

Cons:

- Limited to nearby devices
 - iPhone-to-Android transfers are not supported
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5. Using External Storage (SD Card or USB OTG)

If your phone supports expandable storage or USB OTG (On-The-Go), you can transfer files to an external drive.

Steps for SD Card Transfer:

1. **Insert an SD Card** into your phone (if supported).
2. **Move the Video** to the SD card (via File Manager).

Steps for USB OTG Transfer:

3. **Enter the Recipient's Email** and your email.
4. **Send the File** (a download link will be emailed).

Pros:

- No app installation required
- Works for moderately large files

Cons:

- Free version has size limits
- Requires internet
