- No Google Play Store access (apps must be installed via iPhone)

- No iMessage support (only SMS/MMS)
- Some health tracking features may not sync with Apple Health

2. watchOS (Apple's Smartwatch Platform)

Apple Watches run on **watchOS**, which is exclusively designed for iPhones.

Compatibility with iPhones

- **Full Support:** Apple Watches (Series 3 and later) require an **iPhone 6s or newer running iOS 15 or later**.

3. Tizen OS (Samsung's Smartwatch Platform)

Samsung previously used **Tizen OS** for its smartwatches (e.g., Galaxy Watch 3, Galaxy Watch Active 2) but has since transitioned to Wear OS. However, some older models still run Tizen.

Compatibility with Samsung Phones

- **Full Support:** Tizen-based Galaxy Watches work best with **Samsung Galaxy phones (Android 5.0 or later)**.
- **Key Features Available:**
 - Samsung Pay
 - Bixby voice assistant
 - Samsung Health integration
 - Full app support via Galaxy Store

Compatibility with Non-Samsung Android Phones

- **Partial Support:** Tizen watches can pair with non-Samsung Android phones, but some features may be limited.

 - No Samsung Pay (unless the phone supports it)

Garmin OS (Garmin Smartwatches)

- **Best for:** Garmin Venu, Forerunner, and Fenix series
- **Compatibility:**
 - Works with **Android 7.0+ and iOS 13+**
 - Full feature support on both platforms

- Syncs with Garmin Connect, Google Fit, and Apple Health

Huawei HarmonyOS (Huawei Smartwatches)

- **Best for:** Huawei Watch GT, Watch 3, and Watch Ultimate
- **Compatibility:**
- Works best with **Huawei/Honor phones**
- Limited support for non-Huawei Android phones
- **No iOS support**

Factors Affecting Smartwatch Compatibility

2. Bluetooth and Wi-Fi Connectivity

- Smartwatches rely on **Bluetooth 4.0 or later** for pairing.

3. Manufacturer Restrictions

- Apple restricts Apple Watches to iPhones.

2. Garmin Venu 3 / Forerunner 265

- **Pros:**
 - Full compatibility with Android and iOS

- **Cons:**
 - Less app support than Wear OS or watchOS

3. Samsung Galaxy Watch 6 (Wear OS)

- **Pros:**
 - Works with Android and (limited) iOS

- Some features disabled on iPhones
