3. **Automatically** (activates when connected to CarPlay or motion is detected)
4. **When Connected to Car Bluetooth** (activates when paired with a car's system)
5. **Manually** (user must turn it on before driving)
6. Customize **auto-reply messages** and **allowed contacts**.
7. Enable **Activate with CarPlay** if using Apple CarPlay.

On Android (Google Pixel & Other Devices)

1. Open **Settings > Digital Wellbeing & Parental Controls**.
2. Tap **Focus Mode > Driving**.
3. Select **Turn on automatically** or **Turn on manually**.
4. Customize **auto-replies** and **allowed apps**.
5. Some Android skins (Samsung, OnePlus) may have slightly different steps.

On Samsung Devices

1. Go to **Settings > Advanced Features > Driving Mode**.
2. Enable **Auto Launch** (activates when connected to Bluetooth or motion is detected).
3. Set up **auto-replies** and **allowed contacts**.

In-Car Systems (Apple CarPlay & Android Auto)

- **Apple CarPlay:** Automatically enables DNDWD when connected.
 - **Android Auto:** Can be configured to silence notifications while driving.
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Benefits of Using Do Not Disturb While Driving

1. Reduces Distracted Driving

- Prevents phone-related distractions, which account for **1 in 4 car accidents** (NHTSA).
- Encourages drivers to keep their eyes on the road.

2. Promotes Safer Communication
