

Best Practices for Product Photography for Phone Listings

1. Use the Right Equipment

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3. Set Up a Clean and Professional Background

A cluttered or distracting background takes focus away from the product. Follow these guidelines:

A. Use a Neutral Background

- **White or light gray** backgrounds are ideal for most products, as they make colors pop and look professional.
- **Seamless paper rolls** or **foam boards** work well for small to medium-sized products.
- For larger items, use a **clean, uncluttered surface** (e.g., a plain table or floor).

B. Consider Contextual Backgrounds (When Appropriate)

- Some products benefit from **lifestyle shots** (e.g., a watch on a wrist, a mug on a coffee table).
- Ensure the background **complements** the product without overpowering it.
- Avoid busy patterns or bright colors that distract from the item.

C. Use a Sweep for a Seamless Look

- A **sweep** (a curved background that transitions from vertical to horizontal) eliminates harsh lines and creates a professional, studio-like effect.
 - Can be made from **poster board, vinyl, or fabric**.
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4. Master Composition and Framing

How you position the product in the frame affects its appeal. Follow these composition rules:

A. Fill the Frame

- Get **close enough** so the product occupies **70-80% of the frame**.
- Avoid excessive empty space, which makes the product appear small and insignificant.

B. Use the Rule of Thirds

- Enable the **grid overlay** on your phone's camera (Settings > Camera > Grid).

D. Maintain Consistent Spacing and Alignment

- Keep the product **centered** or aligned with the grid for a polished look.
 - Ensure **equal spacing** between multiple products in a single shot.
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5. Focus and Sharpness

Blurry or out-of-focus images make products look unprofessional. Follow these tips:

A. Tap to Focus

- Always **tap the product on your phone screen** to set the focus point.
- For close-up shots, ensure the camera is **not too close** (most phones have a minimum focus distance of ~10cm).

B. Use Manual Focus (If Available)

C. Crop and Straighten

- Crop to **remove distractions** and improve composition.

D. Remove Backgrounds (If Needed)

- Use **background removal tools** (e.g., Remove.bg, Canva) for a clean white background.
- Ensure the product **doesn't have jagged edges** after removal.

E. Maintain Consistency

- Use the **same editing style** across all product images for a cohesive look.
- Save presets in editing apps to apply the same adjustments quickly.

7. Optimize Images for Mobile Viewing

A. Use the Right File Format
