 4. **Email** (your full email address)
 5. **Password**
 6. **Description** (e.g., â??Work Emailâ?)
 7. **Choose IMAP or POP3** (IMAP is recommended for syncing across devices).
 8. **Enter Incoming & Outgoing Mail Server Details** (provided by your email host).
 9. Example for Gmail (IMAP):
 - o **Incoming Mail Server (IMAP):**
 - o Host Name: `imap.gmail.com`
 - o Username: Your full email
 - o Password: Your password
 - o **Outgoing Mail Server (SMTP):**
 - o Host Name: `smtp.gmail.com`
 - o Username & Password: Same as above
 10. **Save & Verify** â?? The iPhone will verify the settings. If successful, your account is ready to use.
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Setting Up Multiple Email Accounts on Android

Android devices offer flexibility in email management, with options to use **Gmail, Outlook, or third-party email apps**. Below are the most common methods:

Method 1: Using the Gmail App (Recommended for Gmail & Non-Gmail Accounts)

The **Gmail app** supports **Gmail, Outlook, Yahoo, iCloud, and other IMAP/POP3 accounts**.

1. **Open the Gmail App** â?? If not installed, download it from the **Google Play Store**.
 2. **Tap Your Profile Icon** â?? In the top-right corner.
 3. **Select Add Another Account.**

Method 2: Using the Default Email App (Samsung, OnePlus, etc.)

Many Android phones come with a **pre-installed Email app** (e.g., Samsung Email, OnePlus Mail).

1. **Open the Email App** ??? If not pre-installed, download it from the Play Store.
2. **Tap Add Account** ??? Usually found in the **menu (â?°)** or **settings**.

Method 3: Using Microsoft Outlook (Best for Office 365 & Exchange)

If you use **Outlook, Office 365, or Exchange**, the **Outlook app** is a great choice.

1. **Download Outlook from the Play Store** (if not installed).
2. **Open the App & Tap Get Started**.
3. **Enter Your Email Address** ??? Outlook will detect your provider.
4. **Sign In** ??? Enter your password and follow the prompts.
5. **Allow Permissions** ??? Grant access to **contacts, calendar, and notifications**.
6. **Add Another Account (Optional)** ??? Tap your profile icon > **Add Account** to include more emails.

- **iOS:** Swipe left on an email to **Archive** or **Delete**.
- **Android (Gmail):** Swipe left/right to **Archive** or **Delete**.

6. Use Email Aliases (For Gmail & Outlook)

- **Gmail:** Add a + before the @ symbol (e.g., yourname+work@gmail.com) to filter emails.
 - **Outlook:** Create aliases via **Outlook.com > Settings > View All Outlook Settings > Mail > Sync Email**.
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Troubleshooting Common Issues

1. Emails Not Syncing

- **Check Internet Connection** ☹️ Ensure Wi-Fi or mobile data is active.
- **Verify Sync Settings** ☹️ Go to **Settings > Accounts > [Email Account] > Sync Settings**.
- **Restart the App or Device** ☹️ Sometimes a simple restart fixes sync issues.

2. Incorrect Password or Authentication Errors

- **Reset Password** ☹️ If you've forgotten your password, reset it via your email provider's website.
- **Enable Less Secure Apps (If Needed)** ☹️ Some providers (like Gmail) may require enabling ☹️Less Secure Apps in account settings (not recommended for security reasons).
- **Use App Passwords (For 2FA Users)** ☹️ If 2FA is enabled, generate an **app-specific password** for your email client.

3. Server Settings Not Working (Manual Setup)

- **Double-Check Server Details** ☹️ Ensure **IMAP/SMTP settings** are correct (check your email provider's support page).
 - **Use SSL/TLS Encryption** ☹️ Most providers require **SSL/TLS** for secure connections.
 - **Port Numbers** ☹️ Common ports:
 - **IMAP:** 993 (SSL) or 143 (non-SSL)
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- **SMTP:** 465 (SSL) or 587 (TLS)

4. Too Many Notifications

- **Customize Alerts** ??? Go to **Settings > Notifications > Mail** (iOS) or **Gmail/Email App > Settings > Notifications** (Android).
- **Use Do Not Disturb** ??? Schedule quiet hours to avoid work emails at night.
