Step 1: Back Up Your Data

For iPhone Users:

- **iCloud Backup** â?? Go to **Settings > [Your Name] > iCloud > iCloud Backup** and tap **Back Up Now**.
- **iTunes/Finder Backup** â?? Connect your iPhone to a computer, open **iTunes (Windows/macOS Mojave or earlier)** or **Finder (macOS Catalina or later)**, and select **Back Up Now**.

For Android Users:

- **Google Account Backup** â?? Go to **Settings > System > Backup** and ensure **Back up to Google Drive** is enabled.
 - **Manual Backup** â?? Transfer photos, videos, and documents to a computer or cloud service (Google Drive, Dropbox, etc.).
 - **Samsung Smart Switch (Samsung Users)** â?? Use Samsungâ??s official tool to back up data to a computer or external storage.
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Step 2: Sign Out of All Accounts

Before resetting, log out of all accounts to prevent activation lock issues and ensure the new owner can set up the device.

For iPhone Users:

1. **Apple ID** â?? Go to **Settings > [Your Name] > Sign Out**. Enter your Apple ID password and tap **Turn Off**.
2. **iMessage & FaceTime** â?? Go to **Settings > Messages > iMessage (toggle off)** and **Settings > FaceTime (toggle off)**.
3. **App Store & iTunes** â?? Open the **App Store**, tap your profile icon, and sign out.

For Android Users:

1. **Google Account** â?? Go to **Settings > Accounts > Google**, select your account, and tap **Remove Account**.
 2. **Samsung Account (Samsung Users)** â?? Go to **Settings > Accounts and Backup > Accounts > Samsung Account > Remove Account**.
 3. **Other Accounts** â?? Check for other logged-in accounts (Microsoft, Facebook, WhatsApp, etc.) and sign out.
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Step 3: Encrypt Your Data (Android Only)

iPhones automatically encrypt data, but Android users should manually enable encryption before resetting to ensure deleted files are unrecoverable.

1. Go to **Settings > Security > Encryption & credentials**.

2. Select **Encrypt phone** (this may take some time).
 3. Enter your PIN, password, or pattern when prompted.
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Step 4: Remove SIM & SD Cards

- **SIM Card** ??? Eject the SIM card tray (using a SIM ejector tool) and remove the card. This prevents the new owner from accessing your contacts or messages.
 - **SD Card** ??? If your phone has an external SD card, remove it to prevent data leaks.
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Step 5: Perform a Factory Reset

For iPhone Users:

1. Go to **Settings > General > Transfer or Reset iPhone**.
2. Select **Erase All Content and Settings**.

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Step 6: Overwrite Data (Optional but Recommended)

For iPhone Users:

For Android Users:
