

Samsung Galaxy S21 Plus Review: Still Worth Buying in 2026

Description

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The Samsung Galaxy S21 Plus, released in early 2021, was a flagship device that struck a balance between premium features and a more accessible price point compared to its Ultra counterpart. Performance and Hardware

Under the hood, the Galaxy S21 Plus is powered by the **Exynos 2100 (or Snapdragon 888 in some regions)**, a flagship chipset that was top-tier at launch. In 2026, while it may not match the latest processors, it still delivers **smooth performance** for everyday tasks, multitasking, and even moderate gaming.

- **RAM & Storage:** The base model comes with **8GB of RAM and 128GB of storage**, which is sufficient for most users. However, there's no microSD expansion, so storage upgrades aren't possible.

• **64MP telephoto (f/2.0, 3x hybrid zoom, OIS)**

• **Five years of security patches (until early 2026)**
