- Tap your **profile icon** in the top-right corner.
- Select **Medical ID**.

Step 2: Edit or Create Your Medical ID

Step 4: Enable "Show When Locked"

1. Ensure the **Show When Locked** toggle is **enabled** (green).
2. This allows first responders to access your Medical ID without unlocking your phone.

Step 5: Add Medical Information (Optional but Recommended)

- Fill in details such as:
 - **Medical Conditions** (e.g., diabetes, asthma)
 - **Allergies & Reactions** (e.g., penicillin, peanuts)
 - **Medications**
 - **Blood Type**
 - **Organ Donor Status**
 - **Weight & Height**

Step 6: Save and Test

1. Tap **Done** to save your Medical ID.
2. To test, lock your iPhone and swipe up to access the passcode screen.
3. Tap **Emergency** in the bottom-left corner, then **Medical ID** to ensure your information is visible.

Using Emergency SOS on iPhone

- **Quick Call for Help:** Press and hold the **side button + volume button** (iPhone 8 and later) to trigger an SOS call.
- **Automatic Contact Notification:** After an SOS call ends, your iPhone can send a message with your location to emergency contacts (if enabled in **Settings > Emergency SOS**).

How to Set Up Emergency Contacts on Android

Android devices vary by manufacturer, but most offer emergency contact features through **Emergency Information** or **Safety & Emergency** settings. Below are general steps for **stock Android (Google Pixel)** and **Samsung** devices.

For Google Pixel & Stock Android Devices

Step 1: Open the Settings App

1. Open **Settings** on your Android phone.
2. Scroll down and select **Safety & emergency**.

Step 2: Add Emergency Contacts

1. Tap **Emergency contacts**.
2. Select **Add contact**.
3. Choose a contact from your address book.
4. Assign a relationship (e.g., spouse, parent).
5. Tap **Save**.

Step 3: Set Up Emergency Information

1. Go back to **Safety & emergency**.
2. Select **Emergency information**.
3. Tap the **pencil icon** to edit.
4. Add details such as:
 5. **Medical conditions**
 6. **Allergies**
 7. **Medications**
 8. **Blood type**
 9. **Organ donor status**

Step 4: Enable Lock Screen Access

1. Ensure **Show emergency info on lock screen** is **enabled**.
2. This allows first responders to view your information without unlocking the phone.

Step 5: Test Your Setup

1. Lock your phone.
2. On the lock screen, tap **Emergency call**.
3. Select **Emergency information** to verify that your details are visible.

For Samsung Galaxy Devices

Step 1: Open the Contacts App

1. Open the **Contacts** app.
2. Tap the **three-line menu** (☰) in the top-left corner.
3. Select **Emergency contacts**.

Step 2: Add Emergency Contacts

1. Tap **Add contact**.
2. Choose a contact from your list.
3. Assign a relationship.
4. Tap **Save**.

Step 3: Set Up Medical Information

1. Go to **Settings > Safety and emergency**.
2. Select **Medical info**.
3. Tap **Edit** and fill in:
4. **Medical conditions**
5. **Allergies**
6. **Medications**
7. **Blood type**
8. **Emergency contact details**

Step 4: Enable Lock Screen Access

1. In **Safety and emergency**, ensure **Show on lock screen** is enabled.
2. Test by locking your phone and accessing **Emergency call > Emergency information**.

Using SOS on Samsung Devices

- **Quick SOS Trigger:** Press the **side key (power button)** 5 times rapidly to send an SOS message with your location to emergency contacts.
- **Configure in Settings:** Go to **Settings > Advanced features > Send SOS messages** to customize.

Additional Tips for Emergency Contact Setup

1. **Keep Information Updated** ☹️ Regularly review and update your emergency contacts and medical details.
2. **Use Multiple Contacts** ☹️ Add at least two emergency contacts in case one is unreachable.
3. **Include ICE (In Case of Emergency) in Contact Names** ☹️ Some older devices may not have dedicated emergency features, so labeling a contact as ☹️**ICE**☹️ **Spouse**☹️ can help.
4. **Teach Family Members How to Access It** ☹️ Ensure loved ones know how to use these features in case they need to assist you.
