 - **Android:** *Settings > Accessibility > Remove Animations* (or *Developer Options > Window/Transition Animation Scale* set to 0.5x or off).
 - **Enable Dark Mode:** Reduces eye strain in low light (*Settings > Display > Dark Mode*).
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4. Improve Accessibility for Easier Use

Accessibility features aren't just for users with disabilities—they can benefit everyone by making phones more user-friendly.

Top Accessibility Features to Enable:

- **Voice Control:**
 - **iPhone:** *Settings > Accessibility > Voice Control* (navigate, open apps, and dictate text hands-free).
 - **Android:** *Settings > Accessibility > Voice Access* (Google's voice control system).
 - **Screen Reader (TalkBack/VoiceOver):**

 - **iPhone:** *Settings > Control Center > Add Hearing* (then enable Live Listen via earbuds).

Battery-Saving Tips:
