• No periscope zoom beyond 5x (unlike Samsung)

Samsung Galaxy S24 Ultra

Samsung's Galaxy S24 Ultra boasts one of the most advanced **quad-camera systems** on the market:

- **Main Camera:**
- **200MP** (f/1.7, 24mm equivalent, OIS, laser AF)
- **Nonacell pixel-binning** (combines 16 pixels into one for better low-light performance)
- **Super Steady OIS** for stable video
- **Ultra-Wide Camera:**
- **12MP** (f/2.2, 13mm equivalent, 120° FOV)
- **Dual Pixel AF** for faster focusing
- **Telephoto Cameras (2x & 10x):**
- **10MP** (f/2.4, 70mm equivalent, 3x optical zoom)
- **10MP** (f/4.9, 240mm equivalent, **10x periscope optical zoom**)
- **Space Zoom** (up to **100x digital zoom**, though quality degrades significantly)
- **Additional Features:**
- **Expert RAW** mode for manual control
- **8K video recording** (limited to 5 minutes)
- **Super HDR** for improved dynamic range
- **AI-powered scene optimization** (real-time adjustments)

Key Strengths:

- **Highest megapixel count** (200MP) for extreme detail
- **Best zoom capabilities** (10x periscope + 100x digital)
- **Brightest display** (2600 nits) for accurate preview

Limitations:

- **Over-processing** in some images (oversharpening, aggressive HDR)
- **Battery drain** with high-resolution modes
- **AI enhancements** can sometimes look unnatural

Google Pixel 8 Pro

Google’s Pixel 8 Pro relies heavily on **computational photography** rather than sheer hardware specs:

- **Telephoto Camera:**
 - **48MP** (f/2.8, 113mm equivalent, **5x optical zoom**)
 - **Super Res Zoom** extends to **30x** with AI processing
- **Additional Features:**
 - **Magic Editor** (AI-powered photo editing)
 - **Best Take** (selects the best expressions from burst shots)
 - **Real Tone** for accurate skin tones
 - **Pro controls** for manual adjustments
 - **4K 60fps video** with **Night Sight Video**

Key Strengths:

- **Best computational photography** (Night Sight, Magic Editor)
- **Most natural-looking HDR** (less aggressive than Samsung)

Samsung: AI-Powered Enhancements & Zoom

Samsung's **Scene Optimizer** and **AI processing** automatically adjust colors, contrast, and sharpness. While this can lead to **vibrant, eye-catching images**, it sometimes results in **oversharpening and unnatural skin tones**. The **200MP mode** is useful for cropping but requires good lighting.

Best for: Users who want **high-resolution shots, extreme zoom, and AI-enhanced editing**.

Google Pixel: AI-Driven Perfection

Google's **Tensor G3 chip** enables **real-time AI processing**, making the Pixel 8 Pro the best for **low-light photography (Night Sight)** and **AI-powered editing (Magic Editor, Best Take)**. The **Real Tone** feature ensures **accurate skin tones** for all ethnicities.

Best for: Users who prioritize **AI-enhanced photography, low-light performance, and post-processing flexibility**.
