Step 1: Prepare Your iPhone for Battery Replacement

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Step 2: Open the iPhone Display

- Use an **iOpener** or **hair dryer** (on low heat) to warm the edges of the display for **1-2 minutes**. This softens the adhesive, making it easier to open.
- **Do not overheat**—excessive heat can damage internal components.

2. Attach the Suction Handle

- Place a **suction handle** near the home button (for iPhone 6/7/8) or the bottom edge (for iPhone X and later).
- Gently pull upward while applying slight pressure to create a small gap.

3. Insert a Pry Tool

- Slide a **plastic pry tool** into the gap and carefully run it along the edges to separate the adhesive.
- **Avoid prying near the top**—this area contains fragile ribbon cables.

4. Lift the Display

- Once the adhesive is loosened, lift the display at a **90-degree angle** (do not fully remove it yet).
 - For **iPhone X and later**, the display is connected by **flex cables**—do not force it open.
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Step 3: Disconnect the Battery and Display

1. Remove the Metal Shield Plate

- Use a **Phillips #000 screwdriver** to remove the screws securing the **battery connector shield**.
- Gently lift the shield and set it aside.

2. Disconnect the Battery

- Use a **plastic spudger** to carefully pry the **battery connector** upward from its socket.
- **Do not use metal tools**—this can short-circuit the logic board.

3. Disconnect the Display Cables

- Remove the screws securing the **display cable shield**.
 - Use a **spudger** to disconnect the **digitizer, LCD, and front camera cables**.
 - For **iPhone X and later**, there are **three connectors**—disconnect all before fully removing the display.
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Step 4: Remove the Old Battery

1. Peel Off the Battery Adhesive Strips

- Most iPhones use **adhesive strips** to secure the battery.
- **For iPhone 6/7/8:** Pull the **black adhesive tabs** at the bottom of the battery.
- **For iPhone X and later:** The adhesive is stronger—use **isopropyl alcohol** to weaken it if needed.

2. Gently Pry the Battery

- If the adhesive is stubborn, use a **plastic pry tool** to carefully lift the battery.
- **Do not bend or puncture the battery**—this can cause a fire or explosion.

3. Clean the Battery Compartment

- Use **isopropyl alcohol** and a **lint-free cloth** to remove any remaining adhesive residue.
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Step 5: Install the New Battery

1. Place the New Battery

- Align the new battery in the compartment, ensuring it sits flat.
